Local Area and Definition: Nyngan District to comprise Bogan, Bourke, Brewarrina, Cobar and Warren Shires, and both horse and rider must reside in the Nyngan Show District or be an active member of Nyngan or Tottenham Pony Clubs for a period of 28 days prior to the Show. Any bona fide residents who do not comply with the above conditions and wish to ride in district events may apply to the Secretary in writing 7 days prior to the Show for consideration of special dispensation. A committee of Ringmaster, President and Vice President to rule on any application received. Any horse or rider competing illegally in district events will be disqualified from taking any further part in the current Nyngan Show.

LOCAL CLASSES - Jackets are not required

Nyngan Show is run under ASC, EA & SHC Rules. Stallions cannot compete in a ridden class - except breed classes - they MUST wear a bit in all classes - Excludes Show Jumping. <u>Entry & Conditions</u>

Bridle number, entry fee & ASC waiver system -a \$10 per horse entry fee applies for the show ring events and covers entry into any of show ring events (excluding show jumping, barrels and working stockhorse). ASC Waivers available from www.nynganshow.com. No bridle number &/or wristband equals no ring entry. All riders must were EA approved Safety Helmets and regulation riding boots must be worn and waivers completed for each event entered otherwise entry will be refused.

Competitors MUST get a bridle number for each horse, clear details must be given, ASC Waivers signed & a \$10.00 event fee paid. In rider classes the rider must give their name to the Steward if placed. One bridle number per horse only. One wristband per rider only. Fees & waivers can be sent to the Secretary prior to the Show.

ANY competitor thought to be trying to misuse this system will risk disqualification of all Nyngan Show results and non-recording of qualifications with ASC, EA, RAS, VAS & SHC.

<u>No events will be held up for competitors in other rings.</u> Only competitors and Show officials are allowed in the main arena. Assistance and/or coaching from outside the arena is not allowed and will result in the competitor being dismissed from the Show.

Any competitors who are awarded a Champion or Reserve Champion in Ring A Sunday are not eligible to compete in hack classes in Ring. B. The Ringmaster reserves the right to make alterations.

Any misconduct on the part of the competitor or parent/guardian of under 18's may result in the refusal of future entries of the competitor/parent/guardian or entry to future Nyngan Shows.

Pleasure Events to be ridden in a snaffle, no spurs or whips. Pleasure Champions are NOT eligible for Supreme.

Drug testing may be carried out at this Show. Competitors must show exhibits as either Show Hunter or Hack, for the duration of the show. Height certificates will be accepted from RAS, EA, & VAS.

All ponies, galloways & hacks must be measured if they do not have a current height certificate. All Child's Pony, Child's Galloway or Child's Hack classes - the child must be under 17.

Only <u>Local Champions</u> are eligible for the Local Supreme Horse and Local Supreme Rider of the Show. Ribbons will be presented on Monday for all Sunday Show ring events, in Ring A.

The Ringmaster &/or Stewards may ask for relevant CURRENT registration papers to be shown to them, all competitors must produce these papers or they will be disqualified, and the result/s will not be recorded. Owners must also be members of their breed society.

Nyngan Show Society does NOT accept any responsibility for any damage or injury caused by any horse or competitor whilst in attendance at the Show.

The Nyngan Show Committee reserves the right to alter the program and judges, and/or to reject any entries/competitor/exhibit, without giving any reason.




GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR ALL SECTIONS

Rams must be Brucellosis-free & all sheep from Ovine Johne's Disease-free flocks. Certificates must be produced prior to unloading.

A statutory declaration from each exhibitor, or his manager, must accompany entries, stating the name of Breeder, how sheep are fed, shearing date, hand or machine shorn, that the sheep have been honestly shorn & that the particulars given are true and correct, otherwise the entry will be deemed informal. Brands on horns and names on ear tags must be securely covered.

A sheep showing an uneven number of teeth may compete in the higher class, instead of being thrown out. For instance, a sheep entered as a milk teeth, but showing one permanent tooth may compete in the two teeth class and so on throughout the sheep sections. The Judge shall class all sheep in pens prior to judging and has the power to transfer any sheep.

Each Judge shall have positive instructions that should any exhibit in his opinion have been improperly treated, grazed, housed, fed, clothed, shown or subsequently shorn in order to disguise the natural tip, he shall pass such exhibit without judging or comment. All sheep must be bred by the exhibitor, all sheep need to carry a NLIS tag, shedding sheep must be one month off shears for contamination purposes.



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



- 5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
- 6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
- 7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
- 8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
- 9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1. Except in the horse section, or otherwise stated, no exhibit/part thereof, can enter in more than one class.
- 2. Exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor. Stock Exhibitors will require particulars as to the age, pedigree, breeder's name (if known) & other information the Committee may request. The Committee reserves the right to disqualify a exhibit not properly entered or regarding which any false statement has been made.
- 3. In any section where there is only one exhibit, the judge may award a 1st, but the exhibit will not be entitled to Champion, unless awarded by the Judge's recommendation.
- 4. The Committee can award prizes on the recommendation of judges, not specified in the prize list.
- 5. The Committee will not be held responsible for any loss/mis-delivery of exhibits, or any damage thereto.
- 6. No person shall act as a judge in any class in which he or she is an exhibitor.
- 7. One or more stewards will be appointed by the Committee to accompany the judges in each section.
- 8. All protests against awards must be handed to the Secretary in writing, with a \$20 deposit, within six hours of posting the awards, it will be submitted to the Protest Committee for consideration. If a protest is deemed frivolous or made without due grounds, the deposit will be forfeited.
- 9. The Protest Committee consists of the President & all available Vice Presidents.
- 10. The Committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel entry without giving any reason.
- 11. A camping fee will be charged to exhibitors to cover ground facilities & electricity.
- 12. The Committee reserves the right to abandon, alter or amend any class or section for any reason, at any time before the actual competition commences.
- 13. **Nyngan Show Society Inc. will not be held responsible** for any accidents that may be caused through, or by any exhibit, & it is a condition of entry that exhibitors shall hold the Committee blameless & indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accidents.

ALL COMPETITORS COMPETE IN ALL EVENTS AT THEIR OWN RISK

- 14. Prize money not collected by two weeks after the show shall be forfeited.
- 15. DEFINITION OF DISTRICT AREA: A competitor must reside in the area bounded by a radius of 80km, east of Nyngan, the NSW/SA border west of Nyngan, the point where the 80km boundary strikes the Bogan River south of Nyngan, and the point where the 80km boundary strikes the Macquarie River to the north of Nyngan. This definition does not apply to Horse & Wool events. For these events see Section A & L.
- 16. Holders of Member tickets have admission to ground for themselves, spouse, children under 16 and one vehicle to Members car park.
